



**06 | Mon – What are you looking for?** | Read [John 1:35-39](#)

John the Baptist pointed Jesus out to two of his disciples. They were so intrigued that they immediately started to follow after Him. Jesus turned and asked them a question that changed the trajectory of their lives...“What are you looking for?” That was the beginning of their life long relationship with Him. If Jesus asked you this very same question right now, what would you say?

**07 | Tue – Who will we go to?** | Read [John 6:61-69](#)

Jesus asks two questions after a difficult teaching: “Does this offend you?” and “Do you also want to leave?” There are times in life when Jesus’ teaching does not make sense. We are tempted to be offended, mad at God for **not** doing the “right” thing. When you find yourself in such a situation, are you tempted to walk away or will you answer like Peter did in verse 68?

**08 | Wed – What should I do?** | Read [Matthew 19:16-22](#)

The young man in this story led an exemplary life as far as his actions. Apparently he felt it was not enough to ensure his eternal life. He wanted to know what more he could or should be doing, yet he was unable to do the one thing Jesus asked of him. Was Jesus looking for a change in behavior or was He revealing the heart of the matter? Ask God to reveal to you if there is anything you value more highly than you value Him.

**09 | Thu – Who gets to be the greatest?** | Read [Matthew 18:1-6](#) and [19:13-15](#)

We all want to be great someday - recognition, our name in lights, our 15 minutes of fame - and so did the disciples. Jesus’ answer to their question was surprising because children were at the bottom of the social ladder in the ancient, status-ordered culture of Jesus’ day. What does it mean to become like a child? A question worth pondering.

**10 | Fri – What do you think?** | Read [Matthew 16:13-18](#)

One of the most important questions we can ever answer is found in verse 15. Jesus has asked his disciples who other people were saying He was. Then Jesus asked what they thought. Does it really matter what those around us think about Jesus? Isn’t what you think about Him the most important? So who is Jesus to you...a healer when you get sick, a problem fixer when life gets difficult, an ATM when there is a financial need or a trusted friend? Be honest. If you don’t like your answer, ask God to help you change it.

**11 | Sat – Where are you going?** | Read [John 14:1-7](#)

Thomas had a gift for honest questions. He did not pretend to understand when he really didn’t. Jesus gave a “who” answer to Thomas’ “where” question. Jesus explained that He wasn’t going to a **place**; He was going to a **person**, His Father. Then Jesus offered the same opportunity to us. Life can be full of uncertainty. Are you looking for a map, a detailed description of what comes next, or can you find security in a Person?
